

## School Fee Summary Document 2023-2024

### Basic Educational Services Fees

Services, supports and materials required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include in-class instruction and supports, handouts, textbooks, mandatory workbooks, paid electronic educational content and photocopying.

### Locker Fee

A locker fee is charged to new students only in our school. This fee is charged *once* in six years. (student keeps the same locker and lock for all six years). The fee is collected and used to purchase new locks when locks are broken or lost.

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### Enhanced Educational Services (assigned by Principal of School)

Services, supports and materials that are not required for a student to successfully complete a prescribed program of instruction as defined in the Guide to Education. Examples may include curricular field trips, programs of choice, cultural activities, options programming. All fees are cost recovery.

#### Art

**Junior High Art** - This course teaches students about different ways of creating art such as ink, watercolors, chalk pastels and oil pastels. There is also a clay unit in the junior high class where the students create animals and people. Students are also provided with sketchbooks in which they develop ideas and complete small scale assignments in pencil and ink.

**Senior High Art** - This course teaches students about creating art for public display. Students work with a wide variety of chalk pastel, oil pastel and oil paint. Each student is provided with a sketchbook to develop ideas and complete specific assignments. Students also work with wire, plaster of paris, gauze, beads and clay in a 3D unit.

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### CFI Flight Academy

Students will begin course work, spend time in the simulator working towards the ability to write their private pilot license exam at the end of year. Fee is for instruction, simulation time and workbooks. Course takes place at CFI Flight Academy. **"If a student completes the 3 years, and if they want to continue their pilot career with us, CFI will grant a credit of \$3,000 CAD to continue the training. The credit granted will be used to obtain the Private Pilot License at CFI Flight Academy, we will not cover training somewhere else"**

<b>Construction</b>	
<b>Junior High Construction</b> - This course will introduce basic woodworking tools and techniques. Students will use those skills to work through a challenge, or series of challenges in order to solve a problem.	
<b>Senior High Construction</b> - This course will introduce the basics of construction and cabinet making through a series of projects. Each project will introduce a basic skill or idea. Once a student has finished these projects, they will have the freedom to develop a project that is of interest to them. As students progress through 2000 and 3000 levels in this course, projects will become more involved, and students will gain a deeper understanding of the required skills.

<b>Cosmetology</b>	
<b>Junior High Cosmetology</b> is an exploratory course where students can try a wide range of Cosmetology components to see where their interests are moving into high school.	
<b>Senior High Cosmetology</b> - This course takes a hands-on practical approach to personal grooming and care as well as teaching the essence of hairstyling and esthetics industries and opportunities. Teaching students professionalism, customer care and service as well as basic skills to perform a multitude of services, all while enhancing cooperation, collaboration and interactions with customers from the local community. Industry standard hair products are purchased at a significantly reduced cost through a bulk buying arrangement.

This cost covers materials used in the 3D printers or printing and proofing photographs.

<b>Drama</b>	
High School Drama is a 5 credit course, at each of the 10, 20 and 30 levels. In this course students will prepare and perform a small production, allowing them to engage both behind the stage and on stage to explore the five key areas of the curriculum: Movement, Speech/Vocal Development, Acting/Improvisation, Theatre/Script Studies, and Technical Theatre. Most of the preparation work will take place during class time, but students may expect performances to be scheduled on specific evenings.

## **Fabrication**

Students will learn basic sewing and fashion design skills, including both hand sewing and machine.

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## **Food Services**

**Junior High - Meal Prep** - In this course, students learn how to prepare a variety of different meals. Students learn how to budget and prepare different ingredients ahead of time. Students participate in a meal (their choice) exchange at the end of the course. Some items will include but are not limited to: lasagna, wraps, power bowls, smoothie bags and overnight oats. Cost includes appropriate storage containers of prepared meals.

**Junior High - Intro to Baking** - In this course, students will learn the purpose of specific ingredients, alternative ingredients, as well as how to plan and prepare baked goods. Recipes will include but are not limited to: various cookies, muffins, bread (ie. banana bread, etc) and basic squares.

**Senior High Foods - Career and Technology Studies (CTS)** - Students enrolled in this course learn how to produce a variety of foods destined for sale in our Cafeteria. They also hone their job skills by participating in the decision-making and planning phases of kitchen work, as well as develop personal skills valuable in the workplace. Individual educational plans are designed to allow the student to pursue individual interests and are tailored for their skill level. Fees cover food the students prepare and consume in our class.

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## Hairstyling Apprenticeship Program

This course is equivalent to completing your post-secondary education for the Hairstyling Apprenticeship Program and must be taken throughout High School in order to complete. It would also contribute 50+ credits towards their high school diploma.

## Mechanics

**Junior High Mechanics** - This course will cover the basic principles of an internal combustion engine. Students will gain an understanding of these principles through a combination of demonstration, and hands on experience.

**Senior High Mechanics** - This course will introduce a series of automotive principles. This will start with regular maintenance procedures, and extend to diagnostics and major repair and overhaul procedures. This will be accomplished through a combination of demonstration and hands on experience. Students who show an understanding of the required principles may have an opportunity to take on more challenging projects. As students progress through 2000 and 3000 levels in this course, projects will become more involved, and students will gain a deeper understanding of the required skills.
